Harvest Visit To Green Farm, Shepton Mallet - Thursday 12th October 2017

Arrangements for our Harvest visit to Green Farm are in place and the weather for Thursday looks promising! Children should wear a school sweatshirts and trousers suitable for a farm visit (jeans acceptable). Wellies and coats are also essential! It would be helpful if school shoes could be brought to school in a bag to change into after the visit. A water bottle and mid-morning snack are also required.



One of the activities across the morning is the opportunity for children to cook dampers (unleavened bread made from wheat flour and water and baked in wood ashes). Teachers will be aware of children who are wheat/gluten intolerant and shouldn't eat this bread.

Children will eat their lunch on return to school at 1.00 pm. Hot meals will be served as normal, but an hour later. This is why it is important to send your child with a snack to eat mid-morning.



Children are also invited to bring Harvest donations of dried or tinned foods into school on Thursday. These will be taken to Frome Food Bank where volunteers make up food hampers for families in Frome and its surrounding villages who, for many different reasons, come upon hard times.

Thank You To Parents Who Attended The 'Meet The Teacher' Meetings

Children of all ages gain enormous benefit from having parents/carers who are actively engaged in and supportive of their schooling - it really does make a difference to their outcomes. I am sure that you will want to join me in thanking Mrs Baxter, Miss Alison and Mrs McCormack for stepping in to fill this unexpected vacancy, negating the need to cover the class with supply teachers, who good though they may have been, wouldn't have known our school or the strengths and needs of children in Otter Class.

Starting And Transferring School - September 2018

The admissions process for school place applications in September 2018 has begun and the website is live for parents and carers to make their on-line application. For children due to start school for the first time or transfer to a middle school the deadline date for applications is 15th January 2018.
