Introduction

Nunney First School uses cookies on its website www.nunneyfirstschool.co.uk By using our website you consent to the use of cookies.

Our Cookies Policy explains: what cookies are; the law relating to cookie use; how we use cookies; how third-parties we may partner with may use cookies on the website; your choices regarding cookies and further information about cookies.

What are cookies?

Cookies are small pieces of text sent to your web browser by a website you visit. A cookie file is stored in your web browser and allows the website or a third-party to recognise you and make your next visit easier and the website more useful to you.

Cookies can be "persistent" or "session" cookies.

Use of cookies and the Law

The Law requires websites to specifically gain the consent of visitors to be able to store cookies on their computer or other devices. Consent must be achieved through an active 'Opt In' process. Nunney First School is committed to complying with the Law and through its website, will only place cookies on machines where the user has given their consent. Nunney First School provides visitors to its website with clear and comprehensive information about the cookies used by the site and the purposes of these. This information is detailed in the School's Cookie Policy.

How our school website uses cookies

When you use and access our school's website, we may place a number of cookies files in your web browser.

We use cookies to enable certain functions of the service our website provides and to measure how you use the website so it can be updated and improved based on your needs.

We do not use cookies to identify you personally.

We use both session and persistent cookies on the website and we use different types of cookies to run the website:

1. Essential cookies

Some cookies are essential for the operation of our website. In order to provide you with a good experience on this site we provide the functionality to set your preferences for how this site runs when you use it. In order to remember your preferences we need to set cookies so that this information can be called whenever you interact with a page that is affected by your preferences.

2. Performance Cookies

We utilise other cookies to analyse how our visitors use our websites and to monitor website performance. This allows us to provide a high quality experience by customising our offering and quickly identifying and fixing any issues that arise. For example, we might use performance cookies to keep track of which pages are most popular, which method of linking between pages is most effective and to determine why some pages are receiving error messages.

3. Functionality Cookies

We use functionality cookies to allow us to remember your preferences. For example, cookies save you the trouble of typing in your username every time you access some sites (if you do so) and recall your customisation preferences. We may also use functionality cookies to provide you with enhanced services such as allowing you to watch a video online.

4. Third-party cookies

In addition to our own cookies, we may also use various third-parties cookies to report usage statistics of the website.

Your choices regarding cookies

If you'd like to delete cookies or instruct your web browser to delete or refuse cookies, please visit the help pages of your web browser.

However, please note that if you delete cookies or refuse to accept them, you might not be able to use all of the features we offer, you may not be able to store your preferences and some of our pages might not display properly.
